To support children and families by working collaboratively with providers, employers, agencies and communities throughout Utah to ensure the availability of quality, affordable child care.



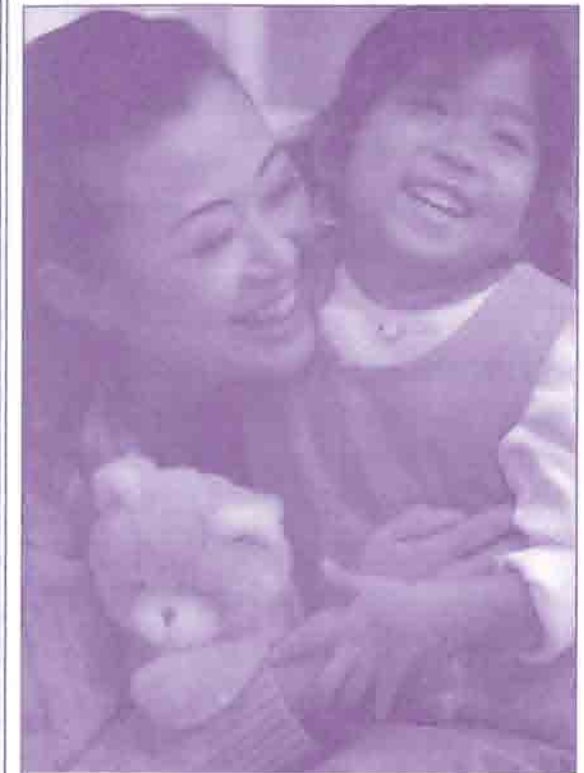
