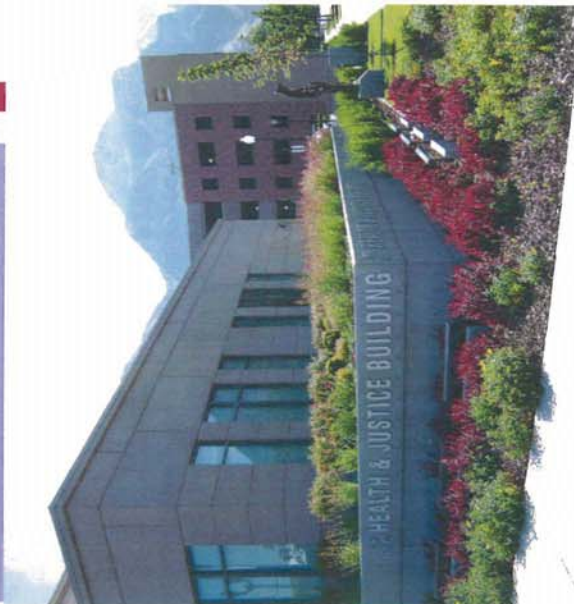


## Mission Statement

### **PREVENTION SERVICES**

#### **SPEAKERS BUREAU**

Presentations addressing important issues such as chemical dependence, media literacy and other specific substance abuse topics are available upon request to anyone in Utah County at no cost. These presentations are adaptable to all ages and are effective in raising awareness in schools, community organizations or businesses.

#### **COMMUNITY RESOURCE LIBRARY**

Our resource library is available to the public at no cost. Pamphlets and brochures include topics such as alcohol, tobacco, illicit drugs, media literacy and violence prevention.

#### **YOUNG ADULT PREVENTION SERVICES**

Prevention services for young adults in Utah County are contracted to Utah Valley State College. Presentations to groups on medication management are available.

#### **UTAH VALLEY YOUTH COUNCIL**

The council consists of members from the every high school in Utah County. Each member volunteers to participate in community and county-wide service projects and serve as an advocate against the abuse of legal drugs and the use of illegal drugs. Leadership positions and trainings are available to interested members.

#### **PARENTS WHO CARE**

#### **Community Policing-Neighborhood Grants**

This program provides mini-grants up to \$500 for community leaders throughout the county to work together to involve youth and improve their neighborhood as outlined by certain criteria of the grant. For information contact: Ben Reaves 851-7178.

### **PRI UNDER 21**

A science-based prevention and early intervention drug assessment and education program for youth under 21. PRI is a three week program that uses research, a work book and object lessons to emphasize abstinence from the use of drugs and teach youth about the associated risks and dangers involved with the use of drugs. ### **YOUTH AND ADULT TREATMENT SERVICES**

The goal of Youth Treatment Services is the placement and/or referral of at risk youth in an appropriate setting. This is done through an assessment process which include SASSI testing (Substance Abuse Subtle Screening Inventory), a parent questionnaire, and interviews with youth and their parent/guardian. The assessment fee is \$80. After the assessment a recommendation may be made for a variety of services depending on the best care for the individual. These may include:

*Substance Abuse Treatment Programs*  
Intensive and general outpatient treatment programs are designed to help adolescents discontinue the use and/or abuse of alcohol and other drugs and learn the life skills necessary to remain drug free. Outpatient services are also provided by local private treatment providers under contract with the Division of Substance Abuse for these programs.

### **The Promise of Women and Families**

Research proves that women with children do better in treatments if they bring their children with them. The Utah County Local Substance Abuse Authority Board further prioritizes women with dependent children as a Utah County priority population. The *Women of Promise* program addresses specific needs such as child care, primary health care, transportation, housing, education, and employment. For more info, call: 851-7696

### **Youth and Families of Promise**

Utah's Youth and Families with Promise Program is designed to address youth problems through early intervention with at-risk youth, ages 10-14, and their families. For more information, call: 851-8470

### **Drug Court Programs**

Drug courts have demonstrated their effectiveness in nearly every court jurisdiction in the United States. Utah County's drug court programs are available to families, youth, and adults; and are managed collaboratively between the Fourth District Court, Fourth District Juvenile Court, the Division of Child and Family Services, and the Utah County Division of Substance Abuse.

### **Foothill Residential Treatment Facility**

This facility allows for separate treatment of male and female clients addressing their unique treatment needs. It also allows for increased detoxification treatment capacity and the ability to conduct public meetings and self help groups while maintaining client confidentiality. For more info, call: 851-7652
